Dr. Carey's primary focus is working with patients with *endocrine neoplasia syndromes*, or tumors of the endocrine system including thyroid cancer, multiple endocrine neoplasia syndromes I and II, carcinoid and neuroendocrine tumors of the pancreas and gut. Endocrine gland tumors can produce unregulated hormones, leading to signs and symptoms of specific hormone overproduction. Some endocrine cancers may be slow growing and over recent years newer diagnostic tests and treatments have become available and consequently patients are experiencing better clinical outcomes.
